Pastor's Pen

"Worthy of Our Time"

"In the Fullness of Time, God sent forth his Son."

As I approach the Advent Season each year, this is the verse that comes to my mind. As a student of the Bible and of history, it's as if all of the key events of the Bible and secular history were pointing arrows toward the birth of Jesus Christ on Christmas. The word for "fullness" in the original Greek means "ripe, ready, completed, finished, done, all the pieces are in place."

Each September the Thrift Sale ladies all know that I will be in to trade in a bunch of jigsaw puzzles that I purchased the prior year for a bunch of gently-used "new" ones. My wife, Jo, loves to put together jigsaw puzzles but I do not have the time or patience. After she has put most all of the pieces into place, I will help her put the last few together to finish the puzzle. Then we stand back and admire how all the pieces fit together to make such a beautiful picture.

That is what this verse is about.

When God had all the details, peoples, kingdoms, even the stars in place, God sent his Son Jesus, the Anointed One, the final piece of the puzzle, to be born in Bethlehem

That event was so momentous and has so changed the world that most everyone would say it was worthy of all the time and effort that went into it. Even our Western World's calendar hinges on the birth of Christ—BC and AD.

For SUMC's Advent Season, Pastor Harlene and I chose this as our theme: "Worthy of our time".

Jesus' birth, life, death and resurrection not only changed the world but they have changed us. It is worth our time to prepare our hearts, minds and souls for the coming of God's Anointed One. Take the time to get ready!

-Take a few minutes each day for devotions and prayer. Pick up one of the Upper Rooms in the Concourse.

-Worship each week. Take your pick: 5pm on Saturday or 8:30am and 10am on Sunday. If you are out of town, find a church to attend wherever you are.

We truly believe that our special efforts will be "Worthy of our time."

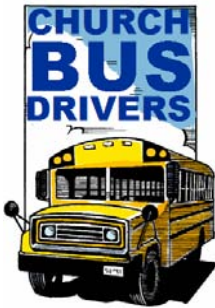

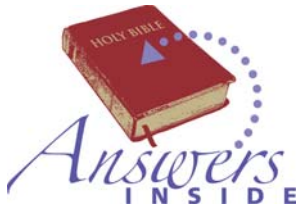

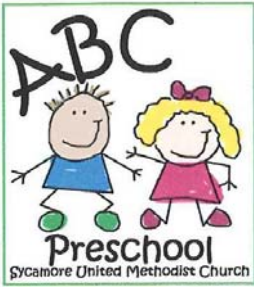

Looking Back

“Looking Back” As I read the article in The Midweek, from 25 years ago, I thought I would share a little history for our newer members. I had the privilege of being the chairman of the administrative board in 1986 when our pastor, Dr. C. Alfred Patten, brought up the topic of our church endorsing the PADS program for the DeKalb/Sycamore area. It would be modeled after a similar program in the city of Aurora; “Public Action to Deliver Shelter” was the official title. As I recall, the board had questions and discussion on whether our church should be one of the founders of this program.

I had two misconceptions: 1) We did not have a need for such a program, as we did not have homeless in our area and 2) When we ultimately decided to approve our church’s participation (Dr. Patten could be very persuasive), we had a large number of churches in the DeKalb, Sycamore area; thus we would only need to host the PADS about once a month.

As it ultimately turned out, there were homeless in our area, and only 5 churches signed up as hostess churches, including ours, and we hosted PADS once a week, every Monday evening. In its 175 year history, our church always meets the challenge, and volunteers stepped forward to serve dinner and breakfast, members staying overnight with the guests, and moving the PADS (bedding) to the church hosting PADS on Tuesday. Most of you have read how this program has grown over the years, and we still help by providing meals to the homeless shelter in DeKalb on Mondays.

My husband and I are proud to belong to the Untied Methodist Church of Sycamore for many reasons: the caring congregation and support give to its members and area residents, the programs for all ages are just a few of our reasons.
