Mother's Comfort

As I write this, I am working on our services for Holy Week. One of the key Scriptures is John 14 where Jesus says to his disciples, "I will not leave you comfortless; I will come to you." Another translation says, "I will not leave you as orphans..." Both versions of that verse sound like Mother's Day to me. I do not want to be guilty of too much generalization, but when most of us think of being comforted, we think of Mom rather than Dad.

Mother's Day is your opportunity to return the comfort.

Years ago there was a country-western song entitled, "Roses for Mama." The song is about a man who goes into a flower shop to buy flowers for his mom for Mother's Day. He knows he should go visit his mom, who lives close by, but he has more exciting plans, so decides to send flowers instead. While he is at the shop, a little boy comes in to buy roses for his mother, but doesn't have enough money. So our friend gives the young boy some money and then buys his own mom a bouquet.

Driving away from the shop, the man passes by a cemetery. Glancing in, he is surprised to see the little boy kneeling on a grave, the bouquet of roses in his hand. After turning into the cemetery, he asks the young boy what he is doing. With tears in his eyes, the boy explains that his mother has been dead a year, and he comes there all the time to talk to her and, on this special day, to give her his roses.

With a lump in his throat the man quickly turns around and drives back to the florist. There, he asks if his mother's flowers have been delivered yet. When the florist tells him "No.," he tells him to cancel the delivery. He wants to deliver them himself.

There is nothing that says "I love you" like simply being there. USA Today did a survey and found that 75% of Americans live within a few minutes of at least one of their parents. Some 23% are within hours of a parent. Only 2% of Americans need to drive for days to see a parent. Just like children need a parent or parents to comfort them, so too our older parents need children who will come to comfort them.

I know many of us have moms and dads who have passed on or, are just too far away for a personal visit. We can only wish we could visit them.

But for those who are close enough, do not let Mom, or for that matter Dad, be alone this Mother's Day.

Remember Jesus word's, "I will not leave you as orphans; I will come to you."

Bring comfort to you mom this Mother's day.

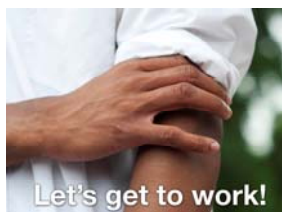

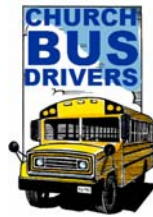

It was a joy to hear Youth Ensemble member WHITNEY MUNRO and her father, Youth Director Joe Munro present a wonderful dialogue sermon last month.

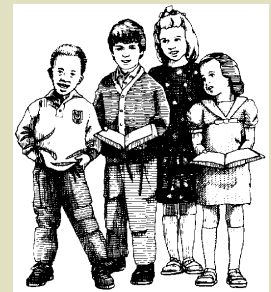

What Happens At Sager Brown Doesn't Stay At Sager Brown

This motto is printed on some t-shirts available at the Sager Brown Campus in Baldwin, Louisiana, and four more members of our church discovered how true it is.

Volunteering at the UMCOR center for two weeks— march 20 through April 1— the witnessed 13,400 disaster relief kits being completed for distribution worldwide in the first week alone.

They joined fellow Methodists from Texas, Georgia, Kansas, Florida, Michigan, and Maryland in the work. In addition to kit assembling in the depot,

school bags and baby items were sewn in the spacious sewing room constructed by a Methodist team from North Carolina.

In collaboration with local Roman Catholics, surplus federal food items were distributed on campus to registered seniors whose incomes met federal guidelines.

Activities off campus included planting flowers at a senior center in Baldwin, sorting donated clothes at a women's shelter, volunteering at a Head Start school and at the new consolidated elementary school. This school

is on tribal land belonging to the Chitimacha Tribe which exchanged use of the property for some in another area of the parish (county).

All Donated items not meeting specifications are distributed in the Baldwin community or may be taken by the volunteers to their own home areas for distribution.

This year, items were brought back and donated to Hope Have, Safe Passage, and Love, INC. Thank you, SUMC members, for all of your donations!
